"You can sit here," the lady on the bus said, making room for me.


"Thank you," I said, as I gratefully took a seat.










EXPERTISE.





Biting into a piece of handmade chocolate could almost be a religious experience. The nuances of flavor, the texture...no wonder it has been called food of the gods! Knowing what I do now, each time I bite into a piece, I think of how complex the process of its creation was. I am utterly grateful to the ancestor who once upon a time, accidentally or on purpose, decided that this delicacy should exist.

So, how does chocolate actually get made? How is it that these bars, drops, squares, bonbons and truffles get to our greedy little paws? Luckily for us, our neighbors down the street run the Belize Chocolate Company, and they offer a fun 30-minute chocolate-making class. Sign us up!

Chris Beaumont, one of the owners, walks guests through the process, sharing some of the history and anecdotes associated with the discovery and process of chocolate. "Every bean every bar born in Belize" is their motto, and their process begins with beans from small farmers in the Toledo district. Did you know that there are different kinds/species of cacao trees and as such, flavors can vary widely?

The Cacao pods (fruit) are first picked, then cracked open to remove the seeds. A thick (delicious) pulp surrounds approximately 50-60 cacao beans. They are fermented then sun-dried then roasted, ready for the next process which involves cracking the bean shells.

To our surprise, we learn that the enterprising farmers also make a delicious tea from the cracklings! Truly no waste there! After a taste of the dried beans, we take turns at a metate. What is a metate you may ask? It's an old-fashioned grinder, with base made of super heavy stone, with a smaller oblong handle (mano) that is used to mash and grind down the cracked beans (nibs) until they form a thick paste. The process to get the nibs to turn into a liquor would take about three days using a machine. Our feeble attempts at the metate suddenly seemed daunting. Thankful for the Chocolate factory's machinery, we tasted the readily available liquor that Chris passed around.

With an idea of what we were meant to create via metate, we again took turns as Chris showed us how the ground nibs were mixed with both sugar and milk...tasting at each step and slowly finding out how the ratio of cocoa to milk/sugar makes a difference. The more sugar and milk, obviously the sweeter and creamier the bar would be. I found myself gravitating towards the less sweet stuff...5-year-old me would have keeled over in shock...so, shhhhh, don't tell her!

Our palates were further pleased when Chris passed around tasting squares of the Chocolate Boutique's confections - from dark to milk and even white, there's a square for everyone!

Chocoholics are invited to visit the boutique on Barrier Reef Drive, and indulge their taste buds. Bite into their delicious brownies and cookies; sip hot chocolate or tea and even pick up some extra products made with the versatile cacao. You can also try your hand at making some chocolate with Chris by taking their class, available weekdays for \$15BZ. Classes last anywhere from half an hour to 40 minutes, and they are informative, fun, and most importantly, TASTY! The crowning glory in the kitchen: Relleno By Mary Gonzalez

The day I learned to make relleno, I felt an indescribable pride. Raised to stand on my own two feet, independent and knowledgeable both at books and in the home, the ability to command a complex, labor-intensive dish is something this home cook aspired to for ages. My only regret is that my mother wasn't around to see this happen...but I am pretty sure she'd be proud – heck she probably would have been learning right alongside me.

For many, the relleno is a family-style meal, which also involves using more than one member of the family's help! When making a big meal like this, it's not uncommon to see Mom, Aunt, Niece and Grandma running the show. Young children are often sent to run errands and learn to steer clear of the cooking space, sneaking ever closer as the smell from the bubbling pot gets more and more intense.

Considered a primarily Mestizo dish, the relleno consists of a mixture of chicken, pork or beef, eggs, and the unique black recado. Recado is mostly known as the red achiote paste that is used to make delicious gravy for stewed chicken. However, there is a black version of it made by burning corn tortillas which is then mixed with a little water, roasted peppers and seasonings to make a paste that then turns the soup a thick black with an indescribable flavor.

There are many steps to the making of relleno, but as always, mise en place (aka, have everything you need at hand) and dedicating a little time and effort will yield truly delicious results! Let us know if you try this version!

Ingredients for an 8-serving batch:

1 4-5 lb chicken
Black Recado – 2 blocks (2"x3"inch
blocks)
1lb ground beef or pork
8 hardboiled eggs
2 eggs
1tbsp chicken consommé

1 tbsp beef consommé

5 cloves garlic, minced

2 tbsp garlic powder
2 medium onions, diced
1 bell pepper, diced
1 stalk celery, diced
15 allspice seeds
2 sticks cinnamon
1tbsp dried oregano
1 bunch cilantro
Water

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Directions:

Wash and clean the whole chicken with lime or vinegar. Keep all skin on (will be used to seal stuffing for later).

Season the beef or pork with 1 cube (1") of recado diluted in a small amount of water (1/4 cup), 1tsp black pepper, beef consommé, ¾ of the diced onion, ¾ green pepper, the garlic, ½ of the celery. Cook the ground meat on medium flame, stirring constantly.

In the meantime, peel hardboiled eggs, and separate the yolks from the whites.

Finely chop/mince the whites or mash with a potato masher until finely ground

Add to the beef mixture and combine over low heat until the egg takes on flavor of the meat (taste test). Turn off the heat

Break 2 remaining (raw) eggs over the beef mixture and stir to combine, and set aside.

Take chicken neck, and reinsert into cavity, sewing the excess neck skin shut to seal.

Stuff the chicken at its base cavity with small handfuls of the ground meat mixture. Add one egg yolk after each handful of the mixture, and repeat process until the cavity is full, or all meat has been used. Sew the cavity shut using the excess skin, to ensure the mixture does not fall out during cooking.

If there is some meat leftover, place in a foil packet. Seal completely then prick a few holes to allow some steam to escape.

Place the whole chicken in a large pot. If you have a foil packet, add it to the pot as well.



In a separate container, dissolve the remaining black recado cubes in some water, then strain into the pot (straining is necessary to prevent the thrash from mixing into the soup). Add cilantro, remaining onion, sweet pepper, celery, chicken consommé, garlic powder, oregano, spice seeds and cinnamon sticks. Add water to the pot until it covers the chicken by about 3 inches.

Place over medium heat until chicken is cooked (approximately 1 hour) – add salt if necessary when checking to see if chicken is cooked.

Serve hot with corn tortillas. (Some serve this with rice).



Offering a tasty lunch menu with tough choices like Sweet Chili Shrimp Skewers, Garlic Ginger Butter Lobster Tail, Coconut Husk Smoked Pork Chops, Coconut Ginger Curry Chicken or Shrimp, Honey Orange Glazed Chicken and Honey Orange Grilled Wings, it's a great idea to order a few of these temptations and share with your party. Each item comes with a choice of two side dishes, such as grilled corn on the cob, baked beans, coconut rice or sautéed green beans. Our favorites? It's all so good, it's hard to pick one, but the smoked pork chop sent us over the moon! Super tender, juicy and packed with grilled goodness, we loved every bite! The grilled wings were full of honey-orange flavor, the succulent sweet chili shrimp skewers were delightful bites of heaven, and need I say anything more than 'grilled lobster tail in garlic ginger butter'? Of course, yummy libations are in order and they take an island favorite, the "Panti Rippa" to a new level with coconut rum, fresh pineapple and sour sop juice. Their Pirate's Rum Punch is a treat even Jack Sparrow would approve of, and why not play some corn hole while being a beach bum? To get to Secret Beach, simply follow the paved road north over the Sir Barry Bowen Bridge until the pavement ends, stay on the road until you see a sign for Secret Beach (approximately three miles), turn left at the sign and follow the signs on the dirt road for another 3.4 miles. Be sure you have a full tank of gas, and other necessities for being out all day, the ride from San Pedro Town usually takes a little more than an hour. Pirate's Not-So-Secret Beach Bar & Grill is open every day, 10AM till sunset, and they accept Master Card & Visa. 
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The classic Boy Scout motto "Be Prepared" could not be better words of advice for those planning a day trip. Be it a day of fishing, manatee watching, cave tubing, or a jungle trip to exotic Maya archeological sites, there are a few things to remember that will make your experience all the more enjoyable. Although some of these tips may seem obvious, it is easy to overlook them in the excitement of your anticipated adventure!

If you have reserved your trip through your hotel or a tour business, you will most likely have a voucher. Many of these businesses list on their vouchers what they recommend you bring. Chances are you will be traveling by boat and there are things you should prepare for, and please don't forget to bring your voucher when you board the boat.

Most excursions pick up people at the docks along the front beach and people who hold things up ultimately make the trip late. That said, if you are waiting to be picked up at 7a.m. don't panic at 7:30 that you missed the boat. Chances are your charter was held up for a dozen different reasons. When a boat does arrive, be sure to find out where it is going, as there are

several different tour companies and tours offered on the island. If vou are transported by motorboat. you can expect wind, sun and ocean spray. The combination of all three can leave you feeling like you just tangoed with a tornado. If you have long hair, plan on tying it back. Hats are always a good idea, but if you cannot secure it on your head, be prepared to hang on to it! Don't forget your sunscreen, and if you are swimming during the trip you should reapply often. Even on a cloudy day the sun can filter through, and with the reflection on the water you can get a lot of sun without realizing it. If you are wearing shorts don't forget to apply sunscreen to the tops of your legs and feet, you will be in a sitting position on the boat and these sensitive "haven't seen the light of day" areas tend to burn fast!

Most boats do not have rest rooms, so be sure to take care of business before boarding, or you may find yourself in an embarrassing "over-the-boat" moment. Remember, many of the rides into the main land take well over an hour and can be on choppy waters. Early morning trips can be a bit chilly, and a light, long-sleeved shirt can provide warmth, as well as sun protection. Depending on the weather, there can be a good amount of ocean spray, so it is possible that whatever you wear and bring along might get wet. A zip lock bag works great to protect your valuable camera and other items, and of course a beach towel can come in handy too.

If you are on a snorkeling trip you should be sure that a) you have your equipment, b) you rented equipment or c) the tour is providing you with equipment. If you are a first time snorkeler, remember that the guides are there to help you, they are pros at this. If you are fishing, find out in advance what, if anything, you are expected to bring. Again, most fishing boats provide the poles

and bait.

Many of the day trips offer jungle excursions to near-by ruins or some incredible cave tubing. On any trip that involves walking, the rule of thumb is "sensible shoes". You will be tromping through jungle pathways that can be slippery when wet, and on surfaces that are uneven. A pair of tennis shoes or a fitted Teva-like sandal is your best bet; slip-on sandals and any kind of heel is a just a bad idea.

Most tour companies will at least bring water along for their guests, and the larger companies stock their boats with coolers full of soda pop, water, Belikin beer and if you are lucky, rum punch. Most guides are attentive and generous; if they have something you need or forgot they will gladly accommodate you as best as possible.

Last, but not least, always daytrip with some cash on you. Even if the land part of your trip includes meals, you may decide you want an additional beverage at the local restaurant or come across a trinket you can't live without. If you have enjoyed your journey, your guide will certainly appreciate a tip. Remember, this is his/her job and that he might do the same trip day after day during the peak tourist season. Was he enthusiastic, friendly and helpful? If so let him know you appreciate the way he shared his incredible world with you.

By the end of the day, you will be tired and elated by the unique experiences of the day behind you. Although you may be eager to pack in as many things in a day as possible while on your vacation, chances are that when you do return to your room, you will be ready for a shower, a low-keyed dinner and bed. Planning a big dinner (with reservations that you may be late for) and a night on the town may not sound all that exciting once you get back. Chances are you will cherish the memory of your day for many years to come, and the more prepared you are, the more you will enjoy your Belizean adventure.
