

"Not yet, boss," he said, "but her clothes got here yesterday."



In my brain the song skips on replay for the next two and a half hours with intermittent content diversions...we're going to the zoo, zoo...OH LOOK a tapir taking a bath...how about you, you, you...WOW check out Junior the jaguar napping, I wanna rub his belly... you can come too, too, too... OMG what's that smell, peccary?... we're going to the zoo, zoo, zoo... AHHH baby monkeys!!!

No matter what our age, going to the zoo resurrects a childlike excitement that never grows old. Sure, as an adult I would prefer to see the exotic animals of Belize in the wild, but we all know how likely those chances are! Somehow I don't see myself spending days hiking deep within the jungle just to catch a glimpse of the elusive jaguar, or following a tapir path for miles in hopes of spotting our national animal. Admiring these beautiful creatures within a natural habitat at the zoo is the closest I will ever get, and with some of them I'm happy to have a fence between us! My, what big teeth you have Junior!

What I love about the Belize Zoo is that it's more of an animal refuge and education center than showcasing animals in cages. Spread over 29 acres, spacious, wild dwellings are suited to the specific needs of each animal. The zoo was started in 1983 when a collection of wild animals used in making documentary films were in desperate need of a

institutions. No wild catches here! These animal ambassadors represent their species in fine fashion, and are essential in educating the public and instilling an appreciation for Belizean wildlife.

One of my favorite zoo residents is the black jaguar, Lucky Boy. In July 2012 I closely followed his heartbreaking story, when he had been

left for dead in a cage after those responsible for his care abandoned him. In an impressive effort by members from the Belize Wildlife Conservation Network, Lucky Boy was rescued. Near death, the emaciated jaguar was found starving and riddled with parasites. Nothing but skin and bones, his recovery was questionable at best, but un-

der intensive care, and taken in by the Belize Zoo, Lucky Boy is now a gorgeous, healthy big cat. Who doesn't love a good animal rescue story? Too bad he was camera shy and wouldn't pose for us!

Being a self-proclaimed 'bird brain,' Panama the Harpy Eagle is a bird of prey that has also captured my heart. Harpy Eagles are the largest and most powerful raptors in the Americas and are considered nearly extinct in Central America. Hatched in 2002 in Panama, under the Harpy Eagle Restoration Program, 'Panama' suffered damage to his left eye when 'exiting the egg' and was deemed un-releasable into the wild. 






Today, San Pedro Town is the bustling tourism capital of Belize. Not so long ago, the island was known as a small fishing village rooted in tradition and the Roman Catholic faith. We have come a long way from a quiet community with under a 100 residents, but not even development can eliminate traditions passed on from one generation to the next. One such tradition is paying homage to the Patron Saint of Fishermen, Saint Peter, who islanders believe has guided San Pedro Town throughout its transition.

Saint Peter is the island's patron saint and namesake, and as such, he is honoured each year. The celebrations embrace the island's beginnings as a small fishing village and promotes unity as well as history, culture and tradition. Growing up, islanders have been taught the importance of Saint Peter, who has watched over generations of fishermen while out at sea, keeping them safe from harm.

For those not acquainted with the Catholic religion, Saint Peter was one of Jesus' 12 Apostles and the first Pope of the Roman Catholic Church. Originally a fisherman, Saint Peter devoted his life to spreading the word of God and died a martyr.

But as the island has evolved into modern times, the celebration of Saint Peter has also evolved and now combines three elements: the religious, the cultural and the festive celebra-

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
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tion. With the main day being June 29th, several activities are organized around this date. The celebration of San Pedro is one of the most anticipated celebrations on the island, not only for residents but for visitors alike.

The religious and cultural celebration are intertwined. "La Bajada" is the traditional and religious celebration that begins with ten days of novenas leading up to Dia de San Pedro. During La Bajada, the Saint's statue is brought down from its permanent altar inside the Catholic Church. On

the tenth night, San Pedro is returned to the church on June 28th, the eve of El Dia de San Pedro.

On the 28th, after an hour's mass inside the church, residents gather outside at the outdoor statue of Saint Peter for La Alborada (all night activities until dawn) to celebrate with a variety of traditional Mestizo dances and music. On the 29th, the annual dawn fishermen mass kicks off the day's activities at 4AM. Attended mostly by males, the well-attended mass gives the fishermen the opportunity to



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be thankful and ask Saint Peter for protection while at sea. The mass of thanksgiving is followed by the annual traditional fishermen breakfast. A procession and blessing of island boats ends the beautiful religious celebrations.

As for festive celebrations, San Pedro Town Council is sure to throw a grand festival with dancing, live entertainment and even fireworks.

If you are lucky enough to be on the island during the celebration in honour of Saint Peter, you are invited to join in the ceremony and fanfare. Not only will you learn a bit more about La Isla Bonita, but you will be a part of an authentic cultural experience.





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There are three official celebrations held in honor of the crustacean delicacy known as the Caribbean Spiny Lobster. Every year on June 15th, after a 4-month honeymoon phase, lobsters can once again be harvested for consumption. Our sister island Caye Caulker originally began celebrating the lobster with a weekend-long festival that has become an annual event warranting a pilgrimage to the sleepy island. The festival boasts a pageant, allday grilling and feasting, and of course, parties along the beach! Placencia Peninsula joined in on

the festivities as well, celebrating in its own uniquely cultural way. Then San Pedro Town joined in, adding its own unique spin to the revelry.

From nightly pub crawls to restaurants' lobster specials to specially-priced daily tour activities and more, there is something for everyone. Taking advantage of the incredible array of services, talented chefs and bartenders on our island, the organizers came up with a weeklong party that culminates in a rocking block party in Central Park. The party is the culmination of the week-long event, and sees

booths serving up all manner of culinary delights specializing in the star of the evening: the lobster!

Since the annual San Pedro Lobster Festival began ten years ago, our parent company *The San Pedro Sun* has had the fun opportunity to be one of the judges for the dishes on offer. That invitation to taste all those culinary creations sounds like a lobster lover's dream come true, doesn't it?! I can't lie; it kind of is...and that's why our staff arm wrestles for the one judge's spot offered to us each year.

I've had the chance to judge

quite a few times, and each time, I'm blown away by the creativity of the chefs/cooks. You know that scene in Forrest Gump, when Bubba kept harping about the various ways to eat shrimp? Well, I've had grilled lobster, lobster kebobs, lobster pad Thai, lobster Pierogi, lobster curry salad in a waffle cone, lobster cannoli, lobster bloody Mary, lobster cheesecake, lobster dip, lobster ceviche, lobster sushi, lobster sliders, lobster ice cream, lobster, lobster, lobster... and they've all been damn delicious! Of course,







we end up with our favorites, tally up the points assigned, and prizes are awarded.

How can YOU enjoy the delicious lobster dishes this coming Lobster Festival? Well, come on over to the big block party at Central Park on Saturday, June 25th. Colorful booths start serving refreshing drinks early in the evening, while cooks fire up their grills. You can hear the sizzle of the grills as the lobsters get a smoky treatment. Some bartenders even go so far as to use the antennae of the lobster to make straws for some, interesting cocktails. While you sip, look around and make your mind up. Do you want to start with the DELICIOUS basics? Dip or ceviche... can't go wrong. Need something a bit heartier? Perhaps a basic grilled lobster tail with the Belizean fixin's of rice and beans and coleslaw/salad? The height of deliciousness!

Then there are the special surprise treats! One year, I got to sample a truly delicious lobster cannoli – creamy, naturally-sweet lobster stuffed inside a crispy sweet shell for an excellent mix of sweet and savory. Then there was a buttery, gooey lobster Pierogi that fulfilled dreams I had no idea I had. I mean, you can't go wrong with luscious pasta stuffed with perfectly seasoned lobster meat. tossed around in herbed butter. Mmmm...Oh, now I'm remembering the curried lobster served

in a waffle cone. It was like a savory ice cream... cold creamy lobster goodness. The same chef also prepared a delightful lobster cheesecake a couple years later... some chefs truly take the competition seriously. And we all benefit with their delicious experiments!

Here's hoping you're ready for the gastronomical delights of the 2016 San Pedro Lobster Festival!







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as that magical ride to my new home.

The magic remains, and in fact it was rejuvenated when I received a wonderful surprise courtesy of my editor and Tropic Air. After 11 years working at the paper, I was gifted a flyover of the BLUE HOLE!

Finally, I'd see the World Heritage Site the way I've only witnessed via photographs and video.

Tropic Air has begun offering this new aerial tour to observe the giant sub marine sinkhole "the way it was meant to be seen...from the air".

The entire tour was an experience in itself. I could see the break where our barrier reef ensures our island's protection, and I could only marvel at the various shades of blue that stretched as far as the eye could see. The one-hour ride took us over the deep blue of the Caribbean Sea, turning to the Lighthouse Atoll...which meant the Blue Hole was getting closer. But even before the star of the morning could be revealed, I along with other guests in the plane oohed and awed over the change in scenery. That stunning turquoise and clear waters of the atoll that make snorkelers' hearts sing...the unmistakable drop off where divers can delight nearby, and unspoiled islands.



I don't think I'll ever lose that frisson of excitement when I board a plane, heading off to parts either familiar or unknown. My first visit to San Pedro, Ambergris Caye came in 1987, when my father splurged on a flight for me to arrive in style. That stomach-churning feeling at the first elevation, followed by the eerie whooshing in my ears soon disappeared, as I opened my eyes and stared in wonder at the vistas below. The kind pilot let me sit next to him, so I had the best vantage point. I got to see the specks of mangroves and tiny islets dotting the blues and greens of the water. Clouds floated by and for a 6-year old, nothing was as special




My heart nearly stopped at the sight of a lone kayaker just paddling away. As we kept flying, we could see one of the iconic fishermen's sailboats (which you can see tied up at the swing bridge in Belize City). There were several kayaks tied to the back. I imagined what it could possibly be like to spend a week or two at a time on a sailboat, simply floating around one of the most iconic locations of our beautiful Belize. A few shadows darted here and there, perhaps some dolphins, rays, sharks...

Our flight kept its track, and on the monitor, I could see the label "BHOLE" and knew we were nearby.











Bit by bit, she drew near. I still find it hard to describe what it felt like – but I felt like I was 6 again.

I took so many pictures (over 500) but nothing compares to what I saw with my own eyes. This stunning sinkhole that has been explored by Jacques Cousteau himself, yet still contains so much mystery, a life source for so much marine life. A large source of income for the tourism industry, and as such, us Belizeans – she lay below, shimmering in the sunlight.

There is no greater feeling...as we flew away to catch the sight of the shipwreck along the reef, I couldn't help but wonder. How did I get so lucky?
