You would think that for someone who's passion is exploring and mapping unchartered caves, they might be hard to impress when it comes to adventure. But for Brad Barcom, a speleologist visiting Belize from Indiana, USA, jumping into the warm, clear Caribbean water to snorkel at the Mexico Rocks Marine Reserve was an off-the-charts experience. "Who needs bats and dark crevices when you can swim with turtles?!" he exclaimed.

Of course, I agree with Brad. I'm not nearly the thrill seeker Mr. Barcom may be, but when I'm indulging in my favorite marine pastime, I couldn't be more excited. I have a mental checklist that quantifies if it was a good day snorkeling. Spotted eagle ray? Check! Nurse sharks? Check! Angelfish? Check! Flamingo Tongues? Check! Christmas Tree worms? Check! Turtles? BINGO!!! My day is now complete!

Not only are sea turtles gorgeous to see as they graze on the seabed or effortlessly glide through the water, their beauty is more than shell deep. When sharing the sea with a turtle I can't help but marvel at the fact that I'm swimming with a true survivor. Against all odds, this creature first hatched on a sandy beach and flippered into the sea (if something didn't eat him first), then survived the perils of the oceanic food chain and man's mess of garbage and obstacles. What makes

seeing these creatures even more incredible is knowing that all three varieties of sea turtles that nest in Belize are Red-Listed by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN). How often can you hang out with an endangered species in their wild habitat?

At most of the marine reserves off Ambergris Caye, the turtle most commonly seen is the Green turtle, which is considered Endangered by the IUCN. Green turtles aren't really green, but their fat is! That's probably how they got their name. These beauties are the second largest sea turtle (next to the Leatherback, which is sometimes seen in southern Belize) and can weigh up to 500 pounds. These vegetarians eat turtle grass (thus the name), and are often seen doing just that, grazing! Juveniles and adults can be found on reefs and over seagrass beds throughout Belize, eating turtle grass or manatee's grass.

Listed as Critically Endangered by the IUCN, Hawksbill turtles are considered the most abundant in Belize per the Sea Turtle Census. In all my years of underwater adventure I have only seen one, and that was at the Hol Chan Marine Reserve. I was so excited I almost swallowed my snorkel! Hawksbill sea turtles were once harvested for their shell which was

used to make jewelry, eye glass frames and other items which is known as tortoise shell. They are normally found near reefs rich in the sponges they like to feed on. Hawksbills are omnivorous and will also eat mollusks, marine algae, crustaceans, sea urchins, fish, and jellyfish.

Last, but not least is the Loggerhead turtle, which is easily distinguished by their large head. I've snorkeled with two over the years, once at Chato's Graveyard near Hol Chan, where conch fishermen clean their catch, and one when looking for whale sharks near the Gladden Split Area. To me these turtles look like the old men of the sea, with big crabby faces and barnacles often attached to their shells. Listed as Endangered by the ICUN, adult loggerhead sea turtles are seen cruising coral reefs looking for crustaceans and mollusks.

No matter what you consider adventure, chances are you'll never forget swimming with turtles. When snorkeling or diving with turtles please admire them from a respectful distance, and never touch or pester them. It is an honor and a privilege to share the sea with these gentle creatures, and as stewards we need to do our best to protect these endangered species.







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


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Tracking our turtles with the Ambergris Caye Marine Turtle Program



The nesting grounds of Robles and Rocky Point beaches on Ambergris Caye are considered one of the most active turtle nesting areas in the entire country. The Ambergris Caye Marine Turtle Monitoring Program at Hol Chan Marine Reserve has been monitoring the area, and gaining consistent data since 2009.

Two types of turtles are known to nest on Ambergris Caye; Loggerhead and Green turtles. When it's time to lay eggs, sea turtles are known to return to nest on the same beach where they were hatched. Depending on the species, a mature female turtle can lay from 70 to 190 eggs, and it takes a span of six to ten weeks for the hatchlings to emerge.

After the eggs hatch, the young turtles must make their way the sea, in hopes of reaching maturity. It's estimated that only one in 1,000 hatchlings will survive to adulthood. Turtles nest every two years, and female turtles are believed to nest up to three times in one nesting season. Despite the little that is known about the migratory behavior of turtles between birth and sexual adulthood, it is estimated that they can live up to 80 years in their natural environment.

According to the 2015 Turtle Report compiled by the Ambergris Caye Marine Turtle Monitoring Programing, the turtle nesting season began in April, when the first turtle was reported to crawl up to its nest, and the season continued until the last week of November, when the last clutch



hatched. Most of the clutches were from Loggerhead (70) and Green turtles (39), along with two Hawksbill turtle nests, which are rare on the island.

In Belize, sea turtles have been a protected species since 1993, and the disturbing of turtle nests or possession of sea turtles is illegal. The selling or trafficking of any sea turtle can constitute an infraction that can result in a fine of up to \$1,000 and up to one year's imprisonment.








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BELIZEAN COVE ESTATES

Folk ore—they are traditions, beliefs and stories passed from one generation to the next. Belizeans have their fair share of these tales, from omens to luck rituals, to creatures straight out of your nightmares! Growing up, we were told these stories and taught to believe in them.

While some of the stories may sound a bit farfetched, how couldn't you believe it when even your "chichi" (grandmother) or "tati" (grandfather) claimed to have personally experienced them! Even with the passing of time, these folklores remain a vital aspect of our culture, defining who we are as Belizeans.

Much like our melting pot of cultures, the folk tales we share are intertwined. The Mestizo believe in evil spirits such as "El Duende" and "La Llorona", while the Creole are believers of "obeah" (dark magic). Most often, these tales were used as a means of disciplining children from doing wrong. I mean some stories were so scary that they were a lesson we did not want to learn first-hand! Of course we are a curious people, and sometimes we tried to test out these theories, only to realize its best to heed our elders' warnings, thus aborting the mission.

One of my favourite folktales passed down to me by my grand-mother was that of "La Xtabai" (La Ish-tah-bai). For years, the tale of La Xtabai had me making sure I was inside the house before the clock struck 9 at night!

But what is La Xtabai you may ask? Well, SHE is every misbehaving kid and drunk man's nightmare!

La Xtabai is supposed to be this gorgeous woman with striking long black hair who lurks at the edge of the bushes. Bear in mind that Belize is still pretty much covered in foliage, and villages in particular are often surrounded by thick forests. While her appearance is that of a goddess, she's really a monster with goat legs and claws that can rip a person apart – at least that's what I was told!

What makes her so terrifying, is that she is an enchantress, luring people to their death. According to the story, La Xtabai targets children who do not obey their parents and are out late at night. She also preys on drunk men, luring them to her embrace.

My grandmother used to tell me that there was no escape from La Xtabail. Even if you evade her at your first encounter, once you have seen her you are sure to disappear within the next 48 hours. The only way to prevent this is by offering a sacred prayer and receiving a blessing from your local priest or bush doctor.

Although this tale may be farfetched, it certainly helped parents get their children to behave. There are many Belizeans who swear relatives and acquaintances have been abducted by La Xtabai.

With each generation that passes, the stories begin to sound more unbelievable. One thing is for sure, these folk tales are what makes us uniquely Belize!



"We trade all of our fish to the next village," the old fisherman told us. "They need fish and they have what we need."

"What is the specialty in the next village?" I asked him.

"They make wooden legs."




