We passed one space that was only wide enough for a scooter but Melody didn't say one swear word.


"I'll be nicer to people that I don't like," she mumbled. "I'll let Glenn win some arguments. No! I won't argue with Glenn at all."



signs of san Pedro showcase artistry and creativity!









Walking the colourful downtown streets of San Pedro Town on Ambergris Caye, you will notice many signs. There are so many that the 1970's song by Five Man Electrical Band comes to mind, 'Sign, sign, everywhere a sign, blocking out the scenery...' But these signs are not blocking the scenery; they are the scenery!

Yes, they are advertising signs for local businesses, restaurants, events and more. Some are humorous to enliven the message. One example is a cliché of a Rastafarian-looking toucan (a large-beaked bird) advertising for a gift shop. Another sign is of a funny monkey and the smelly durian fruit promoting the better aromas of a handmade soap business.

Other signs are quite clever, incorporating recognizable elements of Belize, like our flag displayed in the shape of a permit fish for a fly fishing business or the several fish shapes forming a tiburón (shark in Spanish) for a local lounge. San Pedro is well known for its fly fishing and the Meso-American Reef, making these signs iconic to both San Pedro and Belize. The building which houses the government protec-

tion agency offices and museum, Hol Chan Marine Reserve, displays a beautiful, hand-painted undersea mural.

Many of the signs of San Pedro are hand-painted by island artists. And indeed they are artists! Typically, they are commissioned to add the extra draw of aesthetic appeal. They develop a draft, and incorporate the business context and location into the finished advertising product. Sometimes the signs are painted on unique surfaces like a surf board for a local beach bar. Another artist created a 3-D effect with an exterior form of papier-mâché for an ocean-side night club. The effect is as impressive as the sculpted animal-head entrance for yet another night club.

In real estate, the phrase 'location, location, location' also holds importance for signage and sign space. But not all advertisers have space at their shop or office, including this magazine, *My Beautiful Belize*. Their hand-painted, artistic sign is featured prominently on a wall space around the RC





Elementary School. They pay an annual rental fee to the school, which is used for the school's educational activities, and it gives us the advertising exposure year-round.

Another type of artistic sign that may help you navigate our one-way streets is the street map on street corners, topped with colorful fish sculptures to guide you. These signs were created with technology by a local graphic design company. They too are unique to San Pedro.

Now, if you are looking for souvenir photos with some of our signs, the local trend is large individual letters spelling the name of the resort, business and even our town. Each letter sports a different colour and a subtle design like jaguar spots, fish scales, and coral patterns for example. Our Town Board commissions several of these souvenir signs for community events like New Year's 2019 hosted in Central Park, and they become the 'paradise pic' that tourists send to family and friends while enjoying San Pedro.

So, enjoy your walks, read the signs and know they are a large part of our island culture, not just advertising.

The Belize Audubon Society

Creating a Balance between People and the Environment

In many areas of the world, The Audubon Society is synonymous with birds, birding and habitat conservation. The Belize Audubon Society (BAS), celebrating it's 50th anniversary this year, takes their responsibilities to even a higher level, with the huge task of co-managing seven of Belize's most biologically and topographically diverse protected areas. These areas, which see more than 52,000 visitors a year, include the Blue Hole National Monument, Half Moon Cave National Monument, St. Herman's Blue Hole National Park, Cockscomb Basin Wildlife Sanctuary, Crooked Tree Wildlife Sanctuary, Guanacaste National Park and Victoria Peak National Monument.

Founded in 1969 as a foreign chapter of the Florida Audubon Society, BAS became an independent organization in 1973. Now the longest standing and most respected conservation non-governmental organization in the country, they serve as leaders and development partners who inspire people to live in harmony with and benefit from the environment. This dynamic group tirelessly advocates for the environmental protection of Belize's priceless natural resources while assuring that the general public learns about and fosters an appreciation for its value and sustainable use. As a member-



ship-based organization, they work closely with strategic partners and stakeholders for the benefit of people and the environment. They are funded by entrance fees, grant support, membership dues, contributions, interest income, and other fund generating activities. Once solely manned by volunteers, they now boast a staff of more than 40 dedicated professionals.


Convinced that education is at the heart of environmentally responsible development, each year BAS conducts countless programs within schools, communities, and visitor centers across the country. These include nature schools, summer programs, teacher workshops, awareness campaigns, environment camps, school and community presentations, publications, and special events to nurture growing minds. It is also their goal to involve local community

nities in the management of protected areas, and they facilitate the training of residents who live within buffer communities. They also organize an annual summit hike to Victoria Peak.

Belize Audubon Society's commitment doesn't end at community education as they are keenly involved in several long-term research projects within the protected areas as well. At Cockscomb Basin Wildlife Sanctuary, they engage in the monitoring of jaguars and pumas and their prey, along with the study of Continued on Page 6

insect communities and butterflies within the reserve. At Crooked Tree Wildlife Sanctuary, there have been extensive studies on the behavioral ecology of the Ruby-throated hummingbird and banding migrant birds in the area. BAS has also been instrumental in participating in key monitoring activities within the Lighthouse Reef Atoll, particularly including the two marine protected areas they co-manage at Half Moon Cave and Blue Hole Natural Monuments. Ongoing research and monitoring within this area include Nassau grouper spawning and aggregation, seagrass health assessment, queen conch density survey, spiny lobster density survey, coral bleaching assessment, white-phase Red-footed Booby Bird count, and sea turtle nesting activity on Half Moon Caye and Sandbore Caye.

The community engagement of birding is also high on their priority list. Each February the Belize Audubon Society's staff and members participates in the annual four-day Great Backyard Bird Count where bird watchers of all ages count birds to create a real-time snapshot of bird populations. Participants can count birds for as little as 15 minutes (or as long as they wish) on one or more days of the event and report their sightings online at www.birdcount.org. In 2009 BAS started the Urban Bird watch activity designed to introduce bird conservation and the importance of wintering grounds. Each October, novice birders team up with expert birders and count birds within their urban area. The data collected is uploaded on eBird, and volunteer groups







gather throughout the month in Orange Walk Town, Belize City, Dangriga Town, Punta Gorda Town, San Pedro Town, and Corozal Town. Another big birding event is the Christmas Bird Count which Belize Audubon Society first participated in in 1972. They now coordinate this birding event each year, known as the longest running citizen science survey in the world. The first Christmas Day Bird Count was initiated by ornithologist Frank M. Chapman in 1900 and data collected provides critical information on population trends of birds. In 2018, BAS along with the Belize Tourism Association and the Belize Tourism Board organized the first annual Belize Birding Festival with great success with plans well underway for the second one over the weekend of October 19, 2019.

Over the last 50 years, the country of Belize can be thankful for the unfaltering commitment the Belize Audubon Society has to protect and conserve wild habitats and community livelihoods. To learn more about BAS, please visit their website at http://www.belizeaudubon.org.



International Costa Maya Festival: Keigwited!







From its 1991 beginnings as the Sea and Air Festival to being re-branded as the International Costa Maya Festival - now it is a 'Reignited' festival set to bring entertainment to the masses. Both International and National entertainment will fill the venue in San Pedro Town, from folk and artistic entertainment to heart-pounding modern vibes, the International Costa Maya Festival: Reignited is set to make its mark for 2019.

A re-energized committee will bring back 'Noche San Pedrana' - making it a street affair, bringing the block party vibes that will keep residents entertained with local band Rompe Raja and up and coming young talent Guillermo 'El Criminal' Rivero. Steel band music will add to the island Caribbean feel and highlighting the evening will be the presentation of the eight beautiful delegates from Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, and Panama. These beauties will be vying for the coveted title of Miss Costa Maya - an annual pageant that draws hundreds to the festival grounds. The title is currently held by Honduras' Mary Cruz Cardona Galindo. An all-night street party, Noche San Pedrana will set the tone for the rest of the festival plans on Saturday, July 20th.

Almost everywhere you explore in Belize has you immersed within a tropical paradise bursting with colorful flora and fauna. When visiting the Green Hills Butterfly Ranch in the Cayo District, you get a magical dose of these fabulous features showcasing gorgeous butterflies, jungle foliage and vibrant hummingbirds! Their butterfly pavilion is teeming with approximately thirty species of butterflies in all colors and shapes. From the iridescent Blue Morpho, which is one of the largest butterflies in the world, to the aptly named Malachite in glorious green and black, the air space within the enclosure is aflutter with a kaleidoscope of color. Adding to the enchanted ambiance are the tropical plants that each species depends on for survival, be it food or where they must lay their eggs. Dense with thriving vegetation that vines above and below, along with as many different types of plants as there are butterflies, those who admire the diversity of lush botanicals are in for an extra treat. What can be more beautiful than pretty butterflies floating amidst pretty plants?

Onsite guides, who speak English, Spanish, Dutch, Yucatec Maya, and Creole, give you an up-close and personal tour of the pavilion. There they explain a display of hanging cocoons where butterflies will soon emerge, and as you explore the area, they identify the many flying butterflies and plants, explaining how interdependent they are on each other. It could be easy to stay and explore for hours, as everywhere you look, there's an amazing butterfly or plant to admire.

From the enclosed pavilion, we move outside to a covered patio where they have created a hummingbird viewing area complete







with seating and bird identification books. Using nectar feeders and natural foliage to attract these super-fast dynamos, several types of colorful hummingbirds compete for the food and thoroughly entertain the guests. Photo opportunities are endless, and once again the area begs you to stay and enjoy these darting darlings!

Last, but not least on the tour is the room where leaves laden with butterfly eggs that they have collected from the pavilion gestate in separate enclosures until they hatch into baby caterpillars, grow and ultimately form cocoons. Some of the eggs are even exported out of the country to other butterfly centers around the globe, while some of the cocoons end up back in the pavilion where the cycle repeats itself. It's a fun and fascinating process to learn about and so interesting!

50 years of Belikin

The beer of Belize, Belikin, celebrated its 50th anniversary this year. The actual date in history is May 29, 1969, when the Belize Brewing Company was founded by Eric W. M. Bowen and his son Barry M. Bowen.

It's the beer that almost never was, but as the company records tell it, 'vision' has the company standing strong today. Family encouragement kept the vision going, and despite disappointment from the first attempt and bringing that vision to life, there was no turning back.

Despite being told after a feasibility study that Belize was too small to support a brewery, that international brewers could crush this start-up, and that an independent brewery had little chance of success in Belize, the father and son duo set out to prove the 'experts' wrong.

The Bowens found an ally in Honduras, where Cerveceria Hondureña brewery was managed by Berty R. Hogge. Taking a chance on the Bowens' impressive ideas and their passion, he provided investment capital necessary to begin constructing the brewing company.

All but one piece of equipment was acquired second-hand to begin the process. The oldest piece of equipment was a German brew house built in 1927; an antiquated decommissioned four-vessel brew house which became the heart of Belize Brewing (replaced in 2000). The only brand new item was a diesel boiler that exploded on the day Berty arrived to visit the site. With such an inauspicious start, even the Bowens wondered about their dream. They never gave up, however and pushed for the Belize Brewing Company to

Upon retiring in 1977, Eric Bowen sold his interest to Barry Bowen. In 1981, while Belize gained its independence, Barry was able to buy out Cerveceria Hondureña to also make Belize Brewing an independent, family-owned Belizean company. 50 years later, this still holds true as the company is run by Michael H. M. Bowen, an eighth-generation Belizean.

As for those experts' initial opinion? Well, clearly, 50 years of brewing and serving Belize and even beyond, as well as having the distinction of being one of the largest employers in the country - we could say Eric and Barry proved them SOUNDLY wrong. An island classic: Fisherman's BBQ

Growing up in a fisherman's family and living most of my life on an island, it's surprising how much I don't like fish - crustaceans and even mollusks are more my go-to in a seafood meal. While I'm not a fan of fish, I still do eat it, but on when served in the following ways; crisply fried whole fish, sushi (I love sushi) and, finally, in fisherman's BBQ!

'What is fisherman's BBQ?' one may ask. It's a medley of yummy seafood, basically whatever is caught during a day out at sea, grilled to perfection along with the Belizean holy trinity of vegetables – tomatoes, green peppers, and onion. From the seasonings used to the cooking time, there is a skill in making a tasty platter of fisherman's BBQ. This skill that has been mastered by generations of local men and women with the desire to feed family, friends, and guests only the best. Once you have a freshly prepared fisherman's BBQ, you'll know why we Belizeans think of it as 'home.' It is a reminder of how blessed we are to live surrounded by a bountiful sea.

Ingredients:

4 julienned tomatoes
3 julienned onions
4 julienned green peppers
2 sticks of butter
¼ cup mayonnaise
2 packets of shrimp consommé

Salt and pepper to taste
An assortment of seafood such
as: Fish fillets, Lobster tails (seasonal), Crabs, Conch (seasonal)
Aluminum sheet pan
Aluminum foil



Directions:

In an aluminum sheet pan combine seafood along with vegetables. Season with salt, pepper and shrimp consommé. Spread butter and mayonnaise on top.

Cover with aluminum foil and place atop fired-up grill. Cook for around 20 to 25 minutes, or until lobster tails turn red or until fish becomes opaque and flakes.

No grill? Don't fret! This recipe of fisherman's BBQ can also be cooked in the oven. Bake in a preheated oven at 350°F following the same guidelines as above.

Serve while still hot. Perfect sides include baked potatoes, a garden salad or Belizean rice and beans and tortillas of course! Enjoy!
