Nestled within the lush southern landscape of Belize, just outside the quiet village of Golden Stream in the Toledo District, lies a destination that delights the senses and surprises most travelers, the Belize Spice Farm & Botanical Gardens. Equal parts working plantation, tropical garden, and boutique resort, it's a peaceful, flavorful detour for those exploring the less-traveled side of the country.

The farm originated as a small project in the early 2000s, when its owners, originally from southern India, recognized that Belize's fertile soil and warm, humid climate were ideal for cultivating spices. Today, it's the largest spice farm in Belize and one of the few of its kind in Central America, producing vanilla, cinnamon, black pepper, turmeric, cardamom, and nutmeg, among others.

Visitors are invited to tour the grounds aboard a shaded trail pulled behind a tractor or along walking paths, accompanied by knowledgeable guides who explain the growing, harvesting, and processing of each spice. You can smell, touch, and even taste spices in their raw form, like peeling cinnamon from bark or sampling peppercorns straight from the vine.



There's something undeniably magical about dining over Caribbean waters, the gentle sea breeze, the sound of waves beneath your feet, and sunlight casting ripples below. But at Cool Beans Café, the real magic isn't just in the view, it's in the people behind the counter and the food made with care.

Tucked away in the Boca del Rio neighborhood on the Dreamcatcher Pier, right in front of Ocean Tide Resort, Cool Beans Café is a family-owned gem that's been quietly delighting guests for the past three years. Open daily from 5:30 AM to 5:30 PM, it offers more than just breakfast and lunch; it serves a whole experience of warmth, flavor, and island charm.

The kitchen belongs to Karen, a seasoned cook whose passion and expertise are evident in every detail. She doesn't cut corners. Everything is made from scratch, from her homemade bread to her sauces and dressings, all crafted using fresh, locally sourced ingredients. Her dishes are balanced, flavorful, and filled with personality, just like Karen! Up front, her husband, Ivan, and brother, Javier, keep things running smoothly, providing friendly service and mixing drinks with just as much love and attention.

Guests often come for the stunning ocean view, but they return for the food. The signature avocado toast is anything but ordinary, featuring thick homemade bread topped with mashed avocado, feta

cheese, deviled eggs, cherry tomatoes, and a smoky bacon jam that's unforgettable.

In lobster season, the café shines with cheesy lobster bites, golden and crisp, served with mango sauce and chipotle aioli. For something hearty, try the seafood soup, a rich tomato-based broth filled with lobster, shrimp, fish, and octopus, paired with coconut rice and crunchy totopos, an authentic taste of the Caribbean.

Meat lovers will appreciate the Blue Cheese Arrachera Sandwich: grilled steak glazed with pineapple, topped with blue cheese, avocado, crispy onions, and lettuce, served on a toasted brioche bun. It's bold, savory, and completely satisfying.

Here, dessert shines as well. The frozen Oreo cookie cheesecake is rich and creamy, served perfectly chilled, and pairs beautifully with a cappuccino or a fresh Cool Beans latte from the bar.

Speaking of drinks, Ivan and Javier mix some of the most creative beverages around. Mocktails like the Watermelon Basil are refreshing and unique. If you're looking for a stronger sip, try the floral Rose Frizz made with gin, or the Mezcalito, served in a cantarito rimmed with Tajín, which delivers a smoky, citrusy kick.



Then come the margaritas! Over 17 flavors, from dragon fruit to the crowd-favorite Side Chick Margarita, made with strawberry and lemon-infused tequila. Better yet, weekends bring 2-for-1 margaritas, a great way to sample their extensive selection.

As a final surprise, every Wednesday from 5 PM to 9 PM, the café hosts Sushi Night, serving beautifully crafted rolls that meet Karen's high standards.

At Cool Beans, the food is delicious, but the heart is in the hospitality. As Karen puts it, "Love is the secret ingredient that keeps everyone coming back."

Whimsy and Color: The Art of Walter Castillo

A singular artistic voice captures the vibrant spirit of Belize with bold color and imaginative scenes: Walter Castillo, one of the nation's most beloved and internationally celebrated artists.

"I've been painting for many years," Castillo shares with a warm smile. "My first international exhibit was at 17, held at Cavendish Square in London. I went just for fun, never expecting to sell anything. But I sold out completely, and everything changed after that."

Since then, his work has traveled the globe from Japan and Italy to France and the United States. "I've become a kind of ambassador for Belize," he says. "My art travels, but it always speaks of home."

Born in Nicaragua but raised in San Pedro Town on Ambergris Caye, Castillo was deeply moved by the vibrant culture around him. "When I arrived here, the country overwhelmed me in the best way. The dances, colors, and freedom of the people left a lasting impression."

This inspiration bursts through his canvases with whimsical scenes of village life, breezy coastlines, and lively characters rendered in his unmistakable style. "People ask where I get my inspiration. I say, "Look around. Belize is full of beauty. I paint everyday life through a lens of joy and wonder."

With no formal art education, Castillo developed his style through intuition and experimentation. "I started with raw color, painting what I felt. Over time, this evolved into what I call 'naïve fine art'—whimsical in movement and color, yet detailed and thoughtful."

After decades of work and travel between Europe and Belize, Castillo now lives in the Cayo District, continuing to paint daily. "I put a lot of love into my work. As long as there's Belize around me, there will always be inspiration."

Just eight miles off the coast of Belize City lies a tiny island with a big story. Saint George's Cave is tranguil, uncrowded, and steeped in history; it's the kind of place where hammocks sway in the breeze, cell signals fade, and the Caribbean Sea becomes your constant companion.

Saint George's Caye is best known as the site of the Battle of St. George's Caye in 1798, when a small group of British settlers and formerly enslaved Africans successfully defended Belize from a Spanish invasion. This pivotal moment is honored every September 10th, now a national holiday. But on the island, history is quietly woven into the palms, the breeze, and the rhythm of daily life.

Getting here feels like a secret. With no airports, cruise ports, or commercial ferries, the caye is accessible only by private boat transfer, typically arranged through your resort or host. The 20- to 30-minute ride across turquoise waters is part of the experience, setting the tone Continued on Page 15 for a slower pace.

Once ashore, the island's charm is immediate. There are no cars, crowds, or distractions, just sandy paths, warm smiles, and quiet spaces where the sea is never far away. It takes less than 15 minutes to walk from one end of the island to the other, passing through a mix of historic homes and private retreats.

Prominent Belizean families have owned many beachfront properties for generations. These quiet, elegant legacy homes reflect a longstanding tradition of retreating to the caye for holidays, long weekends, and national celebrations. Though understated, they form part of the island's cultural fabric, a testament to its place in the hearts of Belize's well-established families.



Saint George's Caye also played a lesser-known role in recent history. In the late 20th century, it served briefly as a recreational and training outpost for the British Army Training Support Unit Belize. Soldiers stationed on the mainland occasionally came to the island for water-based exercises and rest from inland jungle training. Today, that chapter has passed, and the island has returned fully to its original purpose: rest, reflection, and reconnection with nature.

Mornings are best spent sipping coffee barefoot, taking in the ocean views. Daytime adventures include


snorkeling along the nearby Belize Barrier Reef, kayaking through mangroves, or exploring sandbars that emerge at low tide.


As evening falls, pastel sunsets fade into star-filled skies. With virtually no light pollution, stargazing here is sublime, and on the clearest nights, the Milky Way stretches in full view above the sea.

The island's primary accommodation, St. George's Caye Resort, is a laid-back, all-inclusive retreat featuring overwater and beachside cabanas, fresh Belizean cuisine, and personalized service. A handful of private vacation rentals are also available. Whether honeymooning, seeking solitude, or simply unplugging, the experience here is unhurried and heartfelt.

Saint George's Caye isn't a place to do it; it's a place to do very little and love every second of it. With its blend of natural beauty, rich heritage, and understated elegance, this small island holds a special place in Belizean culture, offering travelers a rare opportunity to slow down and immerse themselves in the story of a place that is both historic and timeless.

From the moment you step inside, the space invites you to slow down and savor. Handcrafted wooden décor, flickering candlelight, and gentle Latin-Caribbean rhythms create a relaxed, romantic atmosphere.

Cocktails here are more than an afterthought—they're part of the experience. The Ginger Lemon Drop Martini is bright and citrusy, while the Sunset Cosmo and Tropical Fruit Martini strike a just-right balance of refreshing and bold. Island favorites such as Cadillac Margaritas and Frozen White Sangrias round out the bar's impressive offerings, each one crafted with flair.

Our meal began with Seafood Fritters, crispy, golden bites paired with a tangy watermelon rind chutney and creamy coconut curry aioli. The flavors were vibrant and surprising in the best way.

At the culinary helm is Chef Enrique Awe, originally from San Ignacio. With years of experience in U.S. kitchens, he returned to Belize to bring global techniques to local ingredients. His passion shines through every dish, as does his commitment to mentoring young Belizean chefs. Awe has refined the butcher's selections on the Hidden Treasure menu as well, showcasing premium steaks and chops alongside new surf-and-turf offerings.

For the main course, the Bacon-Wrapped Beef Tenderloin stood out for its tenderness and depth of flavor. The Surf and Turf Special, featuring a grilled lobster tail and a juicy pork chop, was presented beautifully, accompanied by herb-mashed potatoes and seasonal vegetables, and proved to be rich, hearty, and satisfying.

We capped off the meal with the restaurant's signature Caye Lime Pie. Creamy, tart, and served on a buttery cookie crust with cherry compote, it was the perfect sweet note to end the evening.




